## Coloured Pencil workshop with Tina Grey



This was a great day. In September we had a wonderful in-house workshop lead by Tina Grey on the use of coloured pencils for drawing & colouring leaves. You would be amazed at the quantity of pencils Tina has!... and she has just bought another full set from Amazon to add to her collection. The "one




thing" that has really stuck with me is to keep your coloured pencils as sharp as you can, resharpening frequently. Also laying down your colours and ensuring you fill in all the white space, using small ellipses

rather like graphite work. Personally I felt that using coloured pencils I was able to get far more



done, more quickly than with watercolour.

A number of our members work almost exclusively in coloured pencil. Some use watercolour first to fill in the "tooth" of the




## Selwyn Gallery Exhibition, Darfield

## Nancy Titchbourne

We were delighted to host Nancy Titchbourne to morning tea during October. Nancy as well as being an accomplished artist is a fascinating recanteur - we were spellbound listening to the story of her life.

There are 3 Titchbourne girls, all of which are very talented. Mary is the cook, Helen "made things, is very logical", Nancy used to be described as the "fairy" as a child. She loved ballet and had hoped to make it her career but her back became too long and she developed bunions, so she swopped over to art as a focus at the age of 16.

From Dunedin, Nancy worked at the Fry's/Cadbury factory for a time, putting on the chocolate squiggles! Her bosses thought this was an excellent job for someone artistic.



Nancy moved to the UK where she met her hubsand who was at Sandhurst. Following their marriage he was posted to Hong Kong where Nancy had a job with the South China Morning Post doing illustrations of things around Hong Kong as well as designing bead work for designer dresses.

From here they moved to Wales, eventually returning to New Zealand.

The three sisters decide to write a book, "Cooks Garden" which Nancy illustrated. This has been very successful.





Nancy was approached by Forest research to do illustrations of insects and birds in Wakawira Forest. She also designed calenders, initially of Fishing flies, but soon started painting flowers in gardens with cats. This was very popular and has been followed by a book "Watercolour World" explaining Nancy's painting techniques. It is worth having for the illustrations alone.

Nancy is a keen gardener and loves botany although her approach is more floral than most of our members. Her approach to starting a painting is to first think - "what do I want to say".

I loved meeting Nancy as it was she who first inspired me, via one of her cat/flower/garden calendars to pick up paint & brushes and try to paint flowers! (I gave up for many years!)

Nancy finished by saying "Work out your passion and really, really find yourself!"

October was a busy month! We also had a workshop with Ann Gray, on bookbinding. This is the second time Ann has Kindly guided members in making their own journals. So many of us are unsatisfied with the quality of paper in pre made journals that Ann suggested making our own! Again this has proved so popular another workshop is planned early next year.
